What is Circles?

In just six weeks, through meaningful discussions, engaging video content, and a practical compassion-focused project, Circles helps young people build relationships while gathering around important conversations.

What is required?

Lots of heart!
A desire to make a difference.
A genuine caring for others.

While our overall school results in the 2024/2025 Alberta Education Annual Results Review were very encouraging, there is always room for significant improvement. One area of particular challenge identified by students in past years is the harmful impact on individuals and school culture when some students speak and act in disrespectful ways toward other students.

Prairie River has such a wonderful group of students and staff, and yet at times students feel uncomfortable with the language, disrespect, or behaviour directed toward classmates. We get it - Middle School years are famous for being a little “edgy” as students push for independence and identity. Our young people may not admit this, but adult influence on the lives of our maturing students is still critically important during this phase of a young person’s life, and families have never been more important!.

The “Live Different - Circles” program is designed to highlight the incredible potential within every single young person. Giving young people an outlet to showcase their decency and willingness to help make the world around them better is key to their development as valued community members!

Honours Recognition Changes



Traditionally Prairie River has awarded students either Silver (75% - 84%) or Gold Honours (85% and above) based on a collective average of all core classes (Math, Language Arts, Science, Social Studies). Starting in January we are changing the format to the following:

- Honours will be awarded in each individual core class (the same percentage criteria)
- Students who achieve honours in 2 - 3 core classes will be awarded Silver Honours
- Students who achieve honours in all 4 cores will be awarded Gold Honours. Both Silver and Gold Honours winners will have an opportunity to take part in whatever honours activity is planned for a given quarter.

Student Achievement Reporting Transparency (Report Cards)



In order to give students, parents and guardians a more clear understanding of student achievement in each class, teachers will be more deliberate in reporting if work was done "independently," or "with support." The vast majority of students will have times where they may receive support, on their way to independently completed assignments. Significant portions of coursework that was heavily supported by teachers and Educational Assistants is important to the development of skills and knowledge, and is considered Formative Assessment. These supports naturally result in higher grades than would have been achieved had a student worked purely independently. Of course Summative Assessments (grades that are reported on Report Cards) must be done independently (accounting for universal strategies that may include a student's use of accommodations such as audio, Read/Write, oral responses, alternate assessment formats, etc).


